Our trees have been in the ground here on our farm for two or more years. The rootstock we use is Bud.118, which is a super-hardy, vigorous Russian root that will produce a precocious (early-to-bear), free-standing 85% size tree. Feel free to ask me about the traits of these selected varieties below, as the descriptions here are much too brief. Ripening dates given are for the North Country.

We are taking paid orders now to receive these trees here at the farm in late April. Michael will contact you when the ground is ready for digging come spring and thus the trees can be picked up for transplanting to your place. The price is \$25 a tree. Send a check made out to 'Heartsong Farm' ASAP to reserve your selections. I'll let you know if a substitution needs to be made.

Dudley	3		Seedling of Duchess with far more keeping ability, mid-September
William's Pride	4		Scab-resistant cultivar, dark red, good crunch, fruity, late August
Bonkers	4		Scab-resistant cultivar, originally NY 73334-35, puckery, late September
Sandow	4		seedling of Northern Spy; red fruit with juicy, crisp flesh; late September
Keepsake	6		Minnesota parent of Honeycrisp, mid-October, and yes, a great keeper
Cortland	6		New England's favorite pie apple, nice tart balance, late September
Macoun	4		Dense crunchiness, a muted sweet flavor, early October
Spartan	4		Dark purple Mac cousin, more snap, complex sweetness, mid-October
St. Edmund's Russet	4		Beautiful English russet, so like a pear in flavor, tender, mid-September
Sweet Sixteen	2		Complex spicy flavor, large and red, Minnesota classic, late September
Topaz	6		Disease –resistant variety from Germany... we're waiting for first fruit
